Bisphosphonates and Dental Care

Taking bisphosphonates can cause issues with dental health if they lead to osteonecrosis where the jawbone doesn't heal properly after a tooth extraction, dental implant placement or minor oral injury. Those taking oral bisphosphonates are at a lower risk for developing osteonecrosis than those taking them intravenously for cancer therapy.
